More industrial buildings, hospitals, and other establishments are choosing epoxy for their floors, not just because they want it but because it is ideal and promotes a safer working environment.


#2 Epoxy Coatings Are Expensive.

#4 Re-coating Every Few Years.




Epoxy is a strong and durable flooring solution that lasts up to 15 years. Amazing, isn't it? It probably has longer life span compared to other floor types.
